Hanging decorations from simple materials

### Spherical strips

This is a design which lends itself to a large number of variations. For simplicity of construction we show the structure laid flat, but in fact the strips can be fanned out to make a spherical decoration. As we show it, all you need is fairly stiff paper and straight wire; variations can be the addition of spaces between the strips, or the decoration or shaping of the strip so that it is wider at the centre than at each end. If a sufficient number of strips are used and if the centre wire is bent to accommodate it, a light bulb could be inserted to make a rather unusual light shade. Should you do this, make sure the materials used are fire-proof.
